Forge Green History Plaque

Halling Historical Society are currently working with the Parish Council to place an information plaque at Forge Green to commemorate its history. So far it has been established that a 'Smithy' (blacksmith) was located near Forge Green at the turn of the twentieth century, but which had disappeared by the 1930s.



The names of several blacksmiths who lived in Halling have been found in the 1861, 1891 and 1901 censuses, along with the delightful name of 'Halling Bottom' as the location of what is now Forge Green. A newspaper article published after the Second World War reports that Forge Cottage was demolished before the 1950s, and within living memory the Halling Bypass took up part of the area where the 'Smithy' had stood. In 2004 a competition was held to choose the name 'Forge Green' for the small area where the war memorial stands today, a name which reflects both the blacksmith and the former cottages. The Historical Society and the Parish Council are now working on the wording of the plaque to record this interesting history.

Special Events in Halling 2025

Halling commemorated the 80th anniversary of VE Day on Thursday 8 May by lighting the parish beacon at 9.30pm which coincided with the national celebration of beacon lighting to mark the end of the Second World War in Europe. Before the beacon was lit, the chairman of the Halling Parish, Richard Thorne, gave a speech thanking those who had given their lives during the conflict for the freedoms we enjoy today.





Halling's second VE Day event was a light and peace parade, on Saturday 10 May, which began at St John the Baptist Church and concluded with the laying of a special wreath at the War Memorial on Forge Green. This was followed by a picnic and party in the Rec where 300 people enjoyed music from the Second World War era, a 'street party' picnic, ice cream, bouncy castles, and glorious sunshine.

The Parish Council is now putting together arrangements for the Halling Fun Day on Saturday 9 August, which will have a music festival theme with bands catering for all tastes. Three tribute bands have already been booked – acts based on David Bowie, Chas and Dave, and the Red Hot Chilli Players will be appearing. Further ahead the first 'Halling Spookfest' will take place in October. Please see the Halling View, the Parish Council website, noticeboards or local banners for further details of these events.

Parish Council News

Halling Parish Council currently has six vacant seats for new Councillors. Noticeboards, Bus Shelters and Benches

In January, five of Halling's noticeboards received a welcome facelift when the coverings were replaced by new UV Perspex covers. The former coverings had been prone to condensation and discolouration, but now all Halling's notices can be seen and read perfectly. The Council is also in the process of removing the bus shelter at Cuxton Marina (A228) and has already replaced the shelter at the junction of Pilgrims Road with the A228.
